

WHAT IS THE CROW WING TRAIL CAMINO?

The Crow Wing Trail is a section of The Great Trail located between Emerson and Winnipeg. The section of this trail between St. Pierre-Jolys and St. Malo is designated as the Crow Wing Trail Camino. It is an affiliate link to the routes of Saint-Jacques-de-Compostelle (Camino de Santiago), a pilgrimage in Europe.

The Crow Wing Trail Camino permits Canadians who are working towards receiving their Compostela to walk 25 kms in their home country, and then continue their journey of the remaining 75 kms, or more, on a Camino pilgrimage route in Spain.

Once pilgrims/hikers have walked a minimum of 100 kms or more (25kms in their home country and 75 additional kms in Europe), with their Credentials (pilgrim passport) filled out, they may apply to receive their Compostella (certificate). To obtain a pilgrim passport, visit Santiago.ca.

Camino means "the way" in Spanish and is a common term used for walking with purpose whether for spiritual wellness, physical wellness or both.

Musee St. Pierre-Jolys parking lot (North end of the trail).
